Take Heed Lest Ye Fall”

Of any real life event that seemed perfect for dramatizing, the sinking of the luxury cruiser R.M.S. Titanic in 1912 rated among the best. There’s the tragic and still not completely resolved sequence of errors that led to the impact with the iceberg, and the delay of nearby ships to come to the rescue. The arrogance of the builders, and society in general to proclaim the ship *unsinkable* – and thus not have enough lifeboats for everyone – was certainly a dramatic element. Then, the sinking, itself. Taking several hours to finally disappear under the icy cold North Atlantic waters, where 1500 people perished. You can’t match that for a tragic ending, especially considering this was her maiden voyage. It’s hard to find a real life event of people arrogantly thinking it was impossible to fail – except in the Bible.

Folks have also made that mistake in real life events in the moral and spiritual realm. 1 Corinthians 10, from which our title is taken, is filled with events that happened to Israel and was applied to the Corinthians. Paul said “their bodies were scattered in the wilderness” (v. 5). This happened because of their idolatry, sexual immorality, and complaining. In one day, 23,000 fell (v. 8). We’re told twice that these things are examples that we should not imitate (vs 6,11) and they are given as (warnings!) to us. Then, appears the warning: “Let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall” (vs 10). They had just been rescued from an “inescapable” situation when Moses parted the Red Sea. They had been provided for abundantly – and they treated it lightly. Paul gives the solution (v 13): “No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.” He didn’t promise this course would always be easy, but He did promise that it would always be there. *-db*
