

2 Out of 3 IS Bad!

Meatloaf sang a song, "Two out of three ain't bad." I think that is the bad theology many have in deciding to be baptized!

1. PAST - They want to be saved to escape the guilt of their past. "With many other words he testified and strongly urged them, saying, "Be saved from this corrupt generation!" So those who accepted his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand people were added to them." (CSB'17 Acts 2:40-41)
2. FUTURE - They want to be saved from future judgment from their sinful past. "Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you (not as the removal of dirt from the body, but the pledge of a good conscience toward God) through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him." (CSB'17 1 Peter 3:21-22)
3. PRESENT - They don't want to be saved from living their own life in the present, so nothing happens. They ignore, "For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be rendered powerless so that we may no longer be enslaved to sin, since a person who has died is freed from sin." (CSB'17 Romans 6:6-7).

If nothing changes after you were baptized, consider nothing changed before because repentance and conversion mean change. If nothing changes after you were baptized, consider nothing will be changed for eternity. Why would God save ►


Thanksgiving Day comes, by statute, once a year; to the honest man it comes as frequently as the heat of gratitude will allow.
