

A Good Thing Gone Bad

Decisions are made by men each day which are based largely on priorities. Setting one's priorities does not generally involve choosing between a "good" thing and a "bad" thing rather it usually involves a choice between two good things. Even among things which are right and lawful, some things are more important than others. A good thing can become bad when it takes priority over another good thing of greater importance.

When Martha chose to prepare a meal for Jesus, she did not choose to commit an ungodly or immoral act. At that particular time, however, sitting at Jesus' feet and hearing his words should have had higher priority, and Mary chose the "better" thing.

On one occasion, the text clearly states that Jesus had compassion on the multitude because they had nothing to eat (Mt 15:32). He cared for their physical wellbeing. In another place, emphasis is shifted. Again, His compassion for the multitude is emphasized, but this time He was sorry for them because they were like sheep without a shepherd (Mk 65:34). He obviously cared for their spiritual wellbeing.

In regard to these two concerns, Jesus revealed the higher priority. "Work not for the food which perisheth, but for the food which abideth unto eternal life" (John 6:27). The spiritual bread should have greater priority in the lives of the people

than the material loaves. But many of the people had their priorities mixed up, and they refused to stay with Him (John 6:26,66).

It is good for a mana to work and provide for his own, but putting job before family is bad. It is good for a woman to be a keeper at home, but putting housework ahead of spiritual endeavors is bad. It is good for churches to give consideration to numerical growth, but putting numerical growth ahead of spiritual increase is bad. It is true that many "things" Christians desire to do are not "bad." It is also certain, however, that some things are "better" than others.
