

A friend was commenting on his page his concern over the fact that instead of asking people today "What do you THINK" about any particular topic, we instead ask "How do you FEEL" about the topic. He received many responses. I added the following which I would like to also share with you because this has long been a concern and pet-peeve with me.

"I have been concerned over this change for many years. We transitioned from believing there is a such thing as objective truth, a right and a wrong, understanding and misunderstanding. Since there is now only "my truth" and "your truth", thus no actual truth, we can only "share" our feelings about topics." "Feelings are important and valuable but they are no substitute for thinking, nor do they take priority. We should not base our thinking on how we feel about the topic under consideration. We should base our feelings on what we believe is true about the topic after study and thought."

"Some years ago, Malcom Gladwell wrote a best-seller "Blink: The Power of Thinking Without Thinking" which contends that our gut feeling and intuition often tells us the truth immediately and without the need for thought."

"In response, Michael R. LeGault wrote "Think: Why Crucial Decisions Can't be Made in the Blink of an Eye." He contends that Gladwell only looks at one side of decision-making without taking into account the critical-thinking process. He claims that the US is morphing from an Age of Reason to an Age of Emotion. As a result, Americans have become politically polarized, giving up on using logic and reason in favor of relying on ideology. We have come to think something is true because we believe it, not because there is evidence to support it."

"The Apostle Paul regularly "reasoned with" people from the Scriptures. God said, "Come let us reason together (Isa. 1:18). Let's use our feelings to strengthen our resolve after first reasoning, studying and thinking about what is true. What I think is not a substitute for Scripture (not the wisdom of man over the wisdom of God), but without thinking I will not understand Scripture or anything else for that matter."
