

DOCTRINE. Does It Really Matter?

Many who claim no religious affiliation are "turned off" by doctrinal preaching and teaching. The whole idea behind the ecumenical movement is that doctrine is not important so long as we agree on "basic issues." Doctrine is boring and what we really need are more social projects and lots of conviviality, is the idea behind this movement. It is an attempt to compromise doctrinal views and unite all who claim to be Christians. But doctrine means teaching. The terms are synonyms.

What if we differ on baptism? Or the organization, work, and worship of the church? Premillennialism? Predestination? Once saved, always saved? It is said that they are doctrine, thus not important to fellowship. One does not have to be right on these so long as he is a good moral, benevolent person. Isn't that wht many believe?

Now to the question that seems to bore people - *What does the Bible teach*? It teaches that though a religious practice may be considered immoral, it is still wrong if it is without Bible authority!

Example: The Pharisees were washing their hands, pots, cups, and vessels as a religious practice (Mt 15:1-9). Is there anything morally wrong with that? No, we highly recommend being sanitary. *Then why did Jesus condemn it?* Because

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they had turned it into a religious ritual. "But in vain do they worship me teaching as their **doctrine** the commandments of men" (Mt 15:9). What more could Jesus have said to impress us with the fact that religious error is just as wrong as moral error?? Washing your hands, pots, cups and vessels is a wholesome practice. Nothing seems immoral about it, but it becomes totally wrong and repulsive to God when one makes a religious practice out of it. Though it seemed like a good idea in the eyes of men, it was a lawless act. There was no law **for** it (on its behalf). Jesus called it doctrine!

Altering the doctrine, whether through addition, subtraction, or substitution, is wrong in God's sight because it is without a law on its behalf.

We are to **obey** the doctrine (Rom 6:17,18). We are **saved** by the doctrine (1 Tim 4:16). We are **accursed** if we pervert the doctrine (2 Jn 9). We are forbidden to teach a different doctrine or go contrary to sound doctrine (1 Tim 1:3,10). We are **warned** to **beware** of strange doctrine (Heb 13:9).

Did you know there are some who **will not endure** sound doctrine (2 Tim 4L3). They are the ones who are bored with doctrine and say it doesn't matter. They are the convivial backslappers who have no real conviction and don't want to be called "narrow-minded." They want a "social" and like to alter their worship to suit their aesthetic interests and entertain themselves thinking they are doing it for God. They never ask, *What do the Scriptures authorize?*

In view of what Jesus said to the Pharisees about introducing the precepts of men into our religion, we must examine our practices.
