

What Shall I Preach? By Paul Keller

What should a preacher preach? Various and conflicting answers have been given by men. While some may have hazy notions as to what should be preached there are plenty of people who have very definite opinions as to "what not to preach". Nor are such people hesitant to express their opinions on a multitude of things which one "out not preach". Fortunately, the gospel preacher is not bound by the fancied of men as t what to preach - not even the prohibitions of his brethren. As a matter of fact, he dares not alter his preaching to suit the whims of men. The word of God tells him what to preach, and how to preach.

He should not seek to please men with his preaching but should always seek to please God (Gal 1:10).

He should maintain sound doctrine, sound faith, sound speech and sound words (2 Tim 4;3; Titus 2:1,8; 2 Tim 1:13).

He should reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine (2 Tim 4:3). He should rebuke them that sin that others may fear (1 Tim 15:20).

He should preach on giving (1 Cor 16:1,2; 2 Cor 8 and 9). He should preach against worldliness and sin in the church (1 Cor 5); on fellowship and discipline (1 Tim 1:3; 1 Cor 5; 2 Thes 3:6,14; Titus 3:10; Rom 16:17). He should preach on unity (1 Cor 1:10-16); Eph 4:1-6). Let his preach against error and false teachers (1 Tim 1:3,4; 4:14,156:20; 2 Tim 2:1619. He should preach on love (1 Jn 3;13-18; 3).

1 Cor 13); on individual responsibility (1 Cor 12); and on every other Bible subject.

A preacher should preach the truth, whether it is popular or unpopular; convenient or inconvenient (2 Tim 4:2).

The gospel preacher ought not to "beat around the bush," but preach plainly on subjects needed by his listeners. To the hypocrites let him preach on hypocrisy. To the fornicators he should preach on the damnation awaiting such. To those causing division in the church let him preach unity. To the stingy let him warn of covetousness an exhort to liberality. To the careless "church-goer" let him preach on the importance of assembling. To the unbeliever he should preach Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. In short, he should preach what is needed that men may have opportunity to hear and repent.

The gospel preacher should preach the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:27). Let him not hesitate to preach anything that is taught in God's word.

If the preacher is rebuked for preaching the truth he need not be discouraged, for the apostle Paul wrote: "The time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ear; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables" (2 Tim 4:3,4). How his preaching is accepted is not the preacher's greatest concern. His greatest concern should be to preach the truth and warn men of the dangers in which their sins involve them -- that men may repent and obey God's commands, to the saving of their souls.
