

How Do We Respond To Being Defamed?

"Even unto this present hour we both hunger, and thirst, and are naked, and are buffeted, and have no certain dwelling place; And labor, working with our own hands: being reviled, we bless; being persecuted, we suffer: Being defamed, we entreat: we are made as the filth of he world, and are the offscouring of all things unto this day" (1 Cor 4:11-13).

Bible-believing Christians today, especially creationists, have become the object of intense vilification by the news media and by self-appointed spokesmen for the scientific and educational establishments. The natural reaction is to respond in kind.

But this is not the spiritual reaction. "Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that we should follow in his steps: Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judges righteously" (1 Pet 2:21-23).

We not only have Christ's example before us, but also his direct command: "Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake...Love your enemies, and pray-

them that persecute you" (Mt 5:11,44).

The apostles endured far more insults and disgrace for Christ's sake than any of us shall ever have to suffer. Yet Paul, speaking for them all, could say in effect "Being reviled, we bless; being defamed, we entreat, even though they call us the filth of the world!" (1 Cor 4:12).

We can trust the Lord to take care of our reputations, for He is more concerned even than we, and His word tells us: "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord" (Rom 12:19). -db
